## In My Heart

*“You have trusted in your wickedness and have said, ‘No one sees me!’”  
(from Isaiah 47:10, NIV).*

## WORD!

**Isaiah 47:10–15, NIV**—You have trusted in your wickedness and have said, ‘No one sees me.’ Your wisdom and knowledge mislead you when you say to yourself, ‘I am, and there is none besides me.’ **11** Disaster will come upon you, and you will not know how to conjure it away. A calamity will fall upon you that you cannot ward off with a ransom; a catastrophe you cannot foresee will suddenly come upon you. **12** “Keep on, then, with your magic spells and with your many sorceries, which you have labored at since childhood. Perhaps you will succeed, perhaps you will cause terror. **13** All the counsel you have received has only worn you out! Let your astrologers come forward, those stargazers who make predictions month by month, let them save you from what is coming upon you. **14** Surely they are like stubble; the fire will burn them up. They cannot even save themselves from the power of the flame. These are not coals for warmth; this is not a fire to sit by. **15** That is all they are to you—these you have dealt with and labored with since childhood. All of them go on in their error; there is not one that can save you.

## SIDEBAR

### God Foretells Destruction

God sent Isaiah as a prophet to the Israelites and people of Babylon. He told them of their sin. He told them they trusted in their own intelligence, astrologers, sorcerers, and people who made predictions. No matter how much the people tried, though, they could not hide their actions from God. Any person or idol separating them from worshiping the one supreme God would lead to their destruction! They needed to worship God alone. No matter how hard they tried, they could not hide their sinful ways from God. Worshiping anything besides God leads to destruction.

#### Nothing Hidden — I will...

**A**—Avoid anything separating me from God.

**V**—Vigorously pray and seek God daily.

**O**—Obey God's Word and godly counsel.

**I**—Invite God to shine His light and show me my hidden sins.

**D**—Determine to turn from any evil practice and worship God alone.

**I will avoid destruction.**

## JAM SESSION

### Nowhere to Run. Nowhere to Hide.

You know God's ways are best. You also know you can't talk your way out of trouble with God. In today's passage, God spoke to the people through the prophet Isaiah. Isaiah's description sounds familiar today. *Do you ever trust in yourself and in your way of doing things? Do you ever try to hide what you are doing from parents, friends, or even God?* Isaiah was blunt. He said God would bring disaster on the people for turning to anyone or anything besides Him. Magic spells, astrology, horoscopes, predictions, and even trusting in your own knowledge and wisdom will mislead you. There is no one greater than God. *How do you feel when you have turned away from God?* God knows. God welcomes you back when you repent and ask His forgiveness.

In today's story, Clint faced a choice. *Would he be honest with himself, his parents, and God? What would you do?*

## WORD!

**Isaiah 49:1–11, NIV**—Listen to me, you islands; hear this, you distant nations: Before I was born the LORD called me; from my mother’s womb he has spoken my name. **2** He made my mouth like a sharpened sword, in the shadow of his hand he hid me; he made me into a polished arrow and concealed me in his quiver. **3** He said to me, “You are my servant, Israel, in whom I will display my splendor.” **4** But I said, “I have labored in vain; I have spent my strength for nothing at all. Yet what is due me is in the LORD’s hand, and my reward is with my God.” **5** And now the LORD says—he who formed me in the womb to be his servant to bring Jacob back to him and gather Israel to himself, for I am honored in the eyes of the LORD and my God has been my strength—**6** he says: “It is too small a thing for you to be my servant to restore the tribes of Jacob and bring back those of Israel I have kept. I will also make you a light for the Gentiles, that my salvation may reach to the ends of the earth.” **7** This is what the LORD says—the Redeemer and Holy One of Israel—to him who was despised and abhorred by the nation, to the servant of rulers: “Kings will see you and stand up, princes will see and bow down, because of the LORD, who is faithful, the Holy One of Israel, who has chosen you.” **8** This is what the LORD says: “In the time of my favor I will answer you, and in the day of salvation I will help you; I will keep you and will make you to be a covenant for the people, to restore the land and to reassign its desolate inheritances, **9** to say to the captives, ‘Come out,’ and to those in darkness, ‘Be free!’ They will feed beside the roads and find pasture on every barren hill. **10** They will neither
