Your child learned today that Paul prayed for and healed the people on the island of Malta in Jesus' name. This week, you and your child can focus on loving those who are different from you.




Love in Any Language

"Well, Janine wanted to follow Jesus, too. She was excited. But Tony and Zack laughed. They didn't think it was cool."



Many people came to hear Paul preach. He was under arrest at a house, with Roman soldiers watching him. He explained the kingdom of God to them from morning until evening. He tried to convince them to believe in Jesus from the Law of Moses and from the words of the prophets.

Some were convinced by what he said. Others weren't. They disagreed with each other. They started to leave when Paul told them something Isaiah

the prophet had said about many of God's people—the Jewish people—a long time ago. Paul said that they would hear but not understand; they would see but not perceive or really comprehend; their hearts were calloused, not soft to God's words; and their eyes were closed, they were stubborn—otherwise they might see and understand and turn to God.

So, God would send His salvation to the Gentiles (anyone who wasn't a Jew) and they would listen and believe. For two years, Paul stayed and taught about Jesus.
