### from your Bible

**Ephesians 1:3–14, NIV**—Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in the heavenly realms with every spiritual blessing in Christ. <sup>4</sup> For he chose us in him before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in his sight. In love <sup>5</sup> he predestined us for adoption to sonship through Jesus Christ, in accordance with his pleasure and will— <sup>6</sup> to the praise of his glorious grace, which he has **freely given us in the One he loves.** <sup>7</sup> In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace<sup>8</sup> that he lavished on us. With all wisdom and understanding, <sup>9</sup> he made known to us the mystery of his will according to his good pleasure, which he purposed in Christ, <sup>10</sup> to be put into effect when the times reach their fulfillment—to bring unity to all things in heaven and on earth under Christ. <sup>11</sup> In him we were also chosen, having been predestined according to the plan of him who works out everything in conformity with the purpose of his will, <sup>12</sup> in order that we, who were the first to put our hope in Christ, might be for the praise of his glory. <sup>13</sup> And you also were included in Christ when you heard the message of truth, the gospel of your salvation. When you believed, you were marked in him with a seal, the promised Holy Spirit, <sup>14</sup> who is a deposit guaranteeing our inheritance until the redemption of those who are God's possession—to the praise of his glory.

### Scripture discussion

Paul wrote this letter to the Ephesian church while he was in prison. Paul wrote this letter in order to explain what a blessing it was to be adopted in Christ. God chose us before the foundation of the world! We are favored, not because of our works, but because of His grace. We have hope in our relationship with Christ and His return again. God has sealed our salvation by the power of the Holy Spirit, and eternity with Him is our inheritance. That's amazing! In today's story, Shonda wasn't feeling very loved. In fact, she felt rejected because she wasn't asked to the Winter Formal. The world's rejection can hurt and cause us to lose perspective. Our value is not in the acceptance of man, but our value is found in the redemptive work of Jesus' death and resurrection. What an incredible blessing!

## 📙 Same Team

the big idea: One in Jesus Christ

lexander was the team's starting point guard and the school's all-time leading scorer. There were tryouts every year, but Alexander wasn't worried.

But then Alexander heard some of his friends talking about a new student—a transfer named Marcus who also played point guard. Word spread throughout the school that Marcus was also an excellent point guard, and he was bigger and more rugged than Alexander.

On the day of tryouts, Alexander was nervous. His spot in the starting lineup was being threatened, and he needed to defend it. Both Alexander and Marcus battled and pushed themselves during the week of tryouts, and both players successfully made the team. But there was only one starting spot for point guard. After an intense practice, Alexander confronted Marcus in the locker room. "You might as well give it up, man. That starting spot is mine."

Marcus crossed his arms and replied, "Is that a fact? I don't know who lied to you, but the only spot where you'll be starting—and staying—is on the bench."

Alexander shoved Marcus against the lockers, and Marcus pushed back. Coach Thompson intervened and pulled the two boys apart.

"You two need to leave your egos at the door and quit fighting," Coach Thompson said. "We are a team. You are both members of a team. Start acting like it, or you'll be finished before the season even starts."

### from your Bible

**Ephesians 2:11–22, NIV**—Therefore, remember that formerly you who are Gentiles by birth and called "uncircumcised" by those who call themselves "the circumcision" (which is done in the body by human hands)— <sup>12</sup> remember that at that time you were separate from Christ, excluded from citizenship in Israel and foreigners to the covenants of the promise, without hope and without God in the world. <sup>13</sup> But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far away have been brought near by the blood of Christ. <sup>14</sup> For he himself is our peace, who has made the two groups one and has destroyed the barrier, the dividing wall of hostility, <sup>15</sup> by setting aside in his flesh the law with its commands and regulations. His purpose was to create in himself one new humanity out of the two, thus making peace, <sup>16</sup> and in one body to reconcile both of them to God through the cross, by which he put to death their hostility. <sup>17</sup> He came and preached peace to you who were far away and peace to those who were near. <sup>18</sup> For through him we both have access to the Father by one Spirit. <sup>19</sup> Consequently, you are no longer foreigners and strangers, but fellow citizens with God's people

Scripture discussion

In today's Scripture passage, Paul discusses how Jews and Gentiles were now united through the blood and sacrifice of Jesus Christ. The Gentiles were considered separated from the Old Covenant. In contrast, the Jews recognized their status and put their hope in their physical distinctions as well as their hope in the Law. Paul humbled both groups, and their need for a savior was revealed. Christ was the means for salvation for both the Jew and the Gentile. They were now one in the Spirit and also members of his household, <sup>20</sup> built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the chief cornerstone. <sup>21</sup> In him the whole building is joined together and rises to become a holy temple in the Lord. <sup>22</sup> And in him you too are being built together to become a dwelling in which God lives by his Spirit.

and one in the Lord. They were to have peace amongst each other and love one another because they were all part of the family of Christ.

Alexander and Marcus faced a similar situation in today's story. They both came from two different basketball teams but then found themselves competing on the same team together. This tense situation created conflict between the two boys. They forgot that they were supposed to work together to achieve the same goals. Their selfishness and lack of love toward one another not only affected them, but the entire team.
