Psalm 47, NIV—Clap your hands, all you nations; shout to God with cries of joy. **2** For the LORD Most High is awesome, the great King over all the earth. **3** He subdued nations under us, peoples under our feet. **4** He chose our inheritance for us, the pride of Jacob, whom he loved. **5** God has ascended amid shouts of joy, the LORD amid the sounding of trumpets. **6** Sing praises to God, sing praises; sing praises to our King, sing praises. **7** For God is the King of all the earth; sing to him a psalm of praise. **8** God reigns over the nations;

God is seated on his holy throne. **9** The nobles of the nations assemble as the people of the God of Abraham, for the kings of the earth belong to God; he is greatly exalted.

Jonathan was excited about the birthday party that his friend, Kevin, was having at the skating rink. He was hoping his mom would allow him to go to the party by himself since it was across the street from his house. Jonathan did not like the fact that his mom still did not let him hang out with his friends the way he wanted. She was always saying that before she would allow him to have more privileges, he had to show he was wise enough to make responsible decisions. He felt that since

he was 11 years old, he was old enough to do more things on his own. He decided to talk to his mother about the party.

"Hey, Mom," he approached her in the den, "you know Kevin's party is coming up this weekend. I was wondering if I could go to the party by myself." Jonathan sat down beside her.

"I hear what you are saying, sweetheart, but supervision is important," his mom said. "What if something happens? When I send you to school, I know that your teachers and other adults will be there to watch over you and help you make good choices. There is a lot of responsibility that goes with a privilege like attending a party alone."

"I know, Mom, but I won't be totally alone. Kevin's mom is going to be there the whole time."

Jonathan and his mother continued to talk. She decided to let him go to the skating party under certain conditions. She also instructed him not to leave the skating rink until the party was over and to call before he left so she could watch out for him. She let Jonathan know she was expecting him to be responsible and obedient and was praying that he made wise decisions while he was there.

Jonathan's mother had to use wisdom as she considered whether or not she should allow her son to attend Kevin's party alone. The way that Jonathan handled this situation would determine how much he would be trusted in the future. What type of situations could come up at a party that would require him (you) to make wise decisions?



Learning From God

Some people think that to be wise you have to be old. Wisdom has nothing to do with your age. It comes from God. Solomon, the main author of the book of Proverbs, was young when he asked God for wisdom to rule over Israel, and God gave it to him.

As you read today's Scripture, circle the different words in the text that describe wisdom and the ways you get wisdom. Then underline all the phrases that describe the good things that come from getting wisdom.

Proverbs 2:1–5, NIV—My son, if you accept my words and store up my commands within you, **2** turning your ear to wisdom and applying your heart

to understanding—3 indeed, if you call out for insight and cry aloud for understanding, 4 and if you look for it as for silver and search for it as for hidden treasure, 5 then you will understand the fear of the LORD and find the knowledge of God.

Proverbs 3:1–6—My son, do not forget my teaching, but keep my commands in your heart, **2** for they will prolong your life many years and bring you peace and prosperity. **3** Let love and faithfulness never leave you; bind them around your neck, write them on the tablet of your heart.**4** Then you will win favor and a good name in the sight of God and man.**5** Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; **6** in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight.

Proverbs 3:13–18—Blessed are those who find wisdom, those who gain understanding, **14** for she is more profitable than silver and yields better returns than gold.**15** She is more precious than rubies; nothing you desire can compare with her. **16** Long life is in her right hand; in her left hand are riches and honor. **17** Her ways are pleasant ways, and all her paths are peace. **18** She is a tree of life to those who take hold of her; those who hold her fast will be blessed.
